English - Pupils are focusing on narrative, dialogue, formal/informal speech,
subjunctive and inferring.
Students will study a range of books to depict features and genre.

Computing - Pupils will identify what makes a good web page and use this information to design and evaluate their own website. Throughout the process learners will pay specific attention to copyright and fair use of media, the aesthetics of the site, and navigation paths.

History - Pupils will begin again in Summer 1 due to lesson rotation.

Music - Pupils will begin again in Summer due to lesson rotation.

Religious education - Pupils will consider current affairs each day by catching up with daily news and reflecting on assembly content.

Physical Education - Pupils will be developing their abilities within net and wall games (Badminton) and learning what it takes to be successful.

PSHE \& British Values - Pupils will examine body image, puberty, the effect of hormones and the uses of each and finally, drugs and alcohol and the effects on the body.


Outdoor Education - Students are continuing their biking journeys by finding pathways, parks and road destinations to add to their experiences of being in the great outdoors.

Maths - Fractions, decimals and percentages as well as exploring area, perimeter, and volume.

Science - Pupils are focusing on 'animals including humans' by looking at life gestation and changes in later life. Following that, students will be studying life cycles in mammals, amphibians, and insects.

Geography - Why do oceans matter? Students are focusing on The Great Barrier reef and its significance. We will be studying the various oceans of the world.

Art \& Technology - Students are looking at mechanisms within a car and will be building their own 'slingshot' car to race their peers.

Modern Foreign Languages - Pupils will
look at how to describe the weather in French.
