English – Pupils will be looking at persuasive writing and create their own article and poetry looking at WWI and the conditions and create their own WWII poem.

Computing - Pupils will be introduced to programming in Logo. Logo is a text-based programming language where pupils type commands that are then drawn on screen. Pupils will learn the basic Logo commands and will use their knowledge of them to read and write code.

History – How lives have changed for children. Pupils will cover Tutor and Victorian times. They will understand working conditions in these times and identify leisure activities and compare them over times.

Music – Pupils will be focusing on identifying rhythm and pitch in a variety of different compositions and using this in their own compositions.

Religious education – Pupils will be looking at the story of Noah from Genesis and making connections between promises in the story of Noah and promises that Christians make.

Physical Education - Pupils will be developing their abilities within Trampolining and creating a sequence focusing on different types of jumps, twists and ways to land.

PSHE & British Values - Pupils will look at living in the wider world. This will include understanding the importance and impact of respect on our learning, development and relationships. To understand Maslow's hierarchy of need and how that may relate to our own wants, needs and priorities. To understand the importance of self-esteem and how to build it up, to be able to recognise the causes of low self- esteem.

Outdoor Education - Encouraging pupils to learn bushcraft skills provides countless benefits, including resilience building, fostering a love for nature, and developing practical survival knowledge. These eight essential skills - fire lighting, outdoor cooking, shelter building, outdoor first aid, plant identification, trap building, target sports, and camouflage and concealment - will equip them with valuable life skills while instilling a deep appreciation for the natural world.
