English- Pupils will explore a range of nonchronological information texts, gaining an understanding of how to correctly use heading and subheadings, alongside comparing the differences between facts and opinions.

Careers- Pupils will learn about the outside agencies involved in getting a job, while also gaining knowledge on employee rights.

Science – Pupils will have the opportunity to explore a range of materials and their properties such as magnetism, density and transparency. Pupils will also learn about the life cycles of both animals and humans.

World Views – Pupils will be looking at morality and the posing the questions that relative morality has on society today.

Physical Education – -Pupils will develop their ability in Net and Wall games (Short Tennis) focusing on how to hold the racquet, different types of shots and gameplay.

PSHE & British Values – Pupils will gain an understanding of what it means to volunteer and the impacts of anti-social behaviour on society. They will also begin to understand what it takes to be employable.

Duke of Edinburgh – Pupils will undertake their second physical element of Duke of Edinburgh. Going to the gym and exploring different workout programmes available to them.
