

English – This term, pupils will be recalling their prior learning on poetry, identifying the features of a poem and using this knowledge to create their own poems based on our current thematic 'Shackleton's Journey'. Pupils will also be using this text to inspire their own short stories.

Computing – Over the term pupils will be developing an understanding of how digital design involves the use of 3D shapes and exploring Tinkercad online software to create their own 3D designs.

History – Pupils will be learning about Babylon including its location on a modern day map, their inspirational figures and the Babylonian culture such as religion and celebrations.

Music – Pupils are going to be building on their current understanding of pitch and will be creating music with a consideration of the correct pitch to use.

Religious education – Pupils will be engaging in in depth conversations about the difference between good and bad, taking into consideration the different beliefs held by various religions.

Physical Education - Pupils will be looking at the skills needed to be successful in a range of athletic activities. Including running, jumping and throwing.

Outdoor Education – The pupils will participate in an introduction to fishing. The pupils will use different equipment, such as rods and poles, and try different techniques and baits. The pupils will learn how to unhook fish and safely return them to the water.

PSHE & British Values – Throughout this term, pupils will be focussing on healthy relationships and learning about the different types of cyberbullying and harassment and what to do if someone or themselves have experienced either.

Maths – Pupils will be recalling their knowledge on place value and decimals, as well as developing their understanding of reflection and proportion of shapes in geometry.

STEM – This term, pupils are going to be investigating a range of different theories through practical activities, regarding light and dark; such as how shadows are created and the differences between translucent, transparent and opaque objects.

Geography – Pupils will be focusing on Antarctica, developing in areas such as climate, location, human and physical features as well as learning about longitude and latitude on maps.

Art & Technology – Pupils will be using our current thematic as their inspiration, comparing and recreating some of the illustrations and using it as inspiration for their own illustrations.

Modern Foreign Languages – This term, pupils will be learning the French for a range of verbs including infinitive verbs as well as using these to read and write their own sentences describing what they are doing.
