

English – Pupils will be focusing on the mythical story of 'The sword and the stone'. Pupils will explore and understand exploration text and develop their letter writing skills. Pupils will use connectives and time words to ensure their explanation text flows logically. Pupils will be able to write both formal and informal letters, expanding their vocabulary and grammar skills.

Computing – Pupils will explore when we need to rotate and crop an image as well as how to use an image editor to make these changes. Learners will then discuss image composition. Pupils will look at photo editing, combining photos and evaluating images.

Pupils will evaluate each other's work giving feedback and what improvements could be made.

History – Pupils will explore Henry VII and how his reign influenced Britain and the Royal family. They will develop their knowledge in understanding how the Tudor period rose to power, children are going to act as historians and investigate whether Henry was a tyrant or a fair ruler.

Music – Pupils will explore the bold and innovative sounds of 20th-century music, with a focus on how technology, structure, and form have shaped musical composition and performance. Pupils will investigate key developments such as electronic instruments, recording techniques, and experimental approaches to rhythm and melody.

Religious education – Pupils explore what Pentecost is and what it means to some Christians. They will be able to describe links between the description of Pentecost in Acts 2 and God as Trinity and explain links between ideas about the kingdom of God in the Bible and what people believe about following God today

Physical Education – Athletics

Pupils will be looking at the skills needed to be successful in a range of athletic activities. Including running, jumping and throwing.

PSHE & British Values –

Pupils learn British values which explores what it is to be a British citizen in a modern and diverse Britain and promote moral and cultural understanding that celebrates the diversity of the UK. Promoting these fundamental British values will usually occur as part of SMSC development. These occur through weekly discussions and assemblies.

Outdoor Education –

Encouraging pupils to learn bushcraft skills provides countless benefits, including resilience building, fostering a love for nature, and developing practical survival knowledge. These eight essential skills – fire lighting, outdoor cooking, shelter building, outdoor first aid, plant identification, trap building, target sports, and camouflage and concealment – will equip them with valuable life skills while instilling a deep appreciation for the natural world. Term 5 will be a focus on cycling. Working on safety, confidence over different terrain and riding in a group and communication.

Maths – position and direction. Pupils will develop their skills, finding and plotting co-ordinates, moving co-ordinates and navigating the position of coordinates through mathematical concepts. Pupils will do this through a range of pictorial, concrete and abstract activities to embed their knowledge and build on prior knowledge.

Science – Pupils will be exploring (day and night, shadows, natural light and nocturnal animals. Each lesson will include practical experiments with data analysis for the pupils to evolve their data collection skills.

Pupils will explore the different ways light can be absorbed, reflected or refracted through practical activities.

Geography –: To understand geographical similarities and differences through the study of human geography of the UK during the Tudor period. Pupils will learn how to use maps to locate historical and geographical features of Tudor towns. Pupils will be able to understand the influence of Tudor architecture on the landscape and community layout.

Art & Technology – This term links to *The Sword in the Stone* through the exploration of creating 3D sculptures that represent strength, identity, and transformation, much like the journey of the young Arthur as he evolves into a king. The themes of bravery, mythical elements, and shaping one's destiny are mirrored in the artistic process of shaping and refining sculptures, drawing parallels between the art of creation and the growth of the legendary figure.

Modern Foreign Languages – French food Pupils will be able to begin to understand a conversation in French. Ask and answer questions Broaden their vocabulary and develop their ability to understand new words. Pupils will read French words carefully and show understanding of words, phrases and simple writing.
