

English – Pupils will be continuing to read 'Shackleton's Journey' and will be writing a range of letters and stories that link to the incredible expedition to the Antarctic. Pupils will also have the opportunity to engage in a range of debates around thought provoking questions that they might have regarding the expedition.

Computing – Pupils will be continuing to develop their understanding of 3D design using a range of programmes such as Tinkercad, and will be completing challenges that involve using skills they learnt in term 5.

History – This term pupils will be learning about Captain James Cook and his famous expeditions including, what goals he hoped to achieve, new discoveries and hardships both him and his crew endured.

Music – Pupils will be continuing to develop their understanding of musical structures and how certain sounds combine to make a pattern.

Religious education – Throughout this term, pupils will be making comparisons between the beliefs of religious and non-religious people, as well as taking into considerations their own thoughts and beliefs.

Physical Education - Pupils are taking part in striking and fielding activities focusing on catching the ball, using different blowing techniques and hitting the ball into space.

Outdoor Education – This term, pupils will be developing their kayaking and canoeing skills at Rutland Water as well as developing the important life skill of swimming.

PSHE & British Values – This term, pupils will be developing their understanding of the value of money and the importance of have a positive attitude around money as well as the cost of living. This will encourage pupils to consider the value of everyday items and how they acquire the necessities in order to go about their lives.

Maths – Throughout this term, pupils will be developing their understanding of multiplying and dividing by 10, 100 and 1000 as well as building upon current knowledge of measurement such as length, weight and volume.

STEM – Pupils will be learning about a range of structures from around the World and how different materials are used to ensure the safety and stability of certain constructions. Pupils will be exploring the best materials through a range of tests and experiments.

Geography – Pupils will be focusing on Antarctica, developing in areas such as climate, location, human and physical features as well as learning about longitude and latitude on maps.

Art & Technology – Pupils will be continuing to use our current thematic as their inspiration, comparing and recreating some of the illustrations and using it as inspiration for their own illustrations.
