English – Pupils will explore the novel *Stone Cold*. Pupils will identify key themes, characters, and events within the text. Pupils will analyse how the story can be adapted for performance and will create their own script based on selected scenes.

Computing - Pupils will explore what AI is and how it is used in everyday life. Pupils will understand key concepts such as machine learning and algorithms. Pupils will investigate real examples of AI tools and evaluate their benefits and limitations.

History – Pupils will examine the reformation and peasants' revolt. Pupils will interpret who won, Catholics or Protestants.

Pupils will investigate the cause of the gunpowder plot.

Music – Pupils will explore the features of West African music. Pupils will understand traditional rhythms, instruments, and cultural context. Pupils will learn to perform basic drum patterns and calland-response structures.

Religious education - Pupils will look at Christianity and explore the beliefs and practices producing a presentation on their learning.

Physical Education – To understand components of invasion games and how to outwit opponents, tactics, gameplay and understanding of different rules.

PSHE & British Values - Pupils will explore key issues related to personal wellbeing, relationships, and decision-making. Pupils will understand how to manage emotions, build positive friendships, and stay safe online and offline. Pupils will discuss reallife scenarios to develop confidence, empathy, and resilience
