

English – Throughout this term, pupils will be reading 'The Thieves of Ostia' and developing their VIPERS skills by identifying and defining key vocabulary, making inferences and retrieving information from the book in order to write their own diary entries.

Computing – Pupils will continue to learn about animation, including designing and creating their own animations using Scratch. Pupils will then move on to learning about programming and how this is used in every day life.

History – With a link to our novel for the term, pupils will be learning about the Romans, including when the Roman era occurred, how the Romans lived, and the significance of Roman armour including their shields.

Music – This term, pupils will be learning about how they can use their voices to create a variety of sounds and will be having a go at reaching different pitches and frequencies

Religious education – In RE, pupils will be learning to appreciate different religions including Christianity, Sikhism and Buddhism, and understanding the purpose of a pilgrimage.

Physical Education – Pupils will be putting their invasion tactics to the test in Basketball and developing their teamwork, dribbling and shooting skills.

PSHE & British Values – Pupils will be gaining an understanding of living in the wider world, including identifying different jobs and careers, as well as what skills might be needed for these. They will also learning about realistic target and goal setting for a chosen career.

Outdoor Education – In outdoor education this term, pupils will be exploring the forest school and putting their bush craft skills to the test, including how to gather, make and light a fire safely.

Maths – In maths this term, pupils will be developing their understanding of multiplication and division as well as recalling and building on previously learnt geometry knowledge, including identifying the names and properties of shapes.

Science – This term, pupils are going to be learning about the human body, specifically the number and names of bones in the body as well as the role of each one. Pupils will be comparing the skeletons of humans to that of animals and finding similarities.

Geography – This term, pupils will be learning about where food comes from, including exotic foods such as the cocoa bean as well as considering the importance of locally sourced food.

Art & Technology – In art, pupils are designing and making their own Roman inspired shield. In Technology, pupils are developing an appreciation for Italian cuisine, including making and tasting their own pasta dishes.

Modern Foreign Languages – In French, pupils will be learning the French for different colours and shapes, and using these to describe one another in full sentences.
