

English – Pupils will explore the novel *Freedom*, using a range of evidence to make predictions and inferences about the text. Pupils will also be focussing on developing their language skills in a range of non-fiction writing tasks including reports, informative texts and persuasive texts.

Computing - Pupils will be focussing on the layers within computing systems in order to learn about the fundamentals of computing from hardware and software to binary code.

History – Pupils will be learning about how ideas and concepts of history have emerged and developed over time, making their own conclusions that have been informed by these ideas.

Music – Pupils will be gaining an appreciation for the style of music 'Baroque' by listening and appraising to a range of songs within its genre whilst considering pitch, tempo and rhythm.

Religious education - Pupils will be considering the beliefs, influences and values of a range of religions to build an understanding and appreciation for these.

Physical Education – Pupils will be recalling and developing their trampolining skills such as, aerial shapes such as the tuck, straddle and pike whilst considering their body posture and straight legs.

PSHE & British Values - Pupils will thinking about their positions in the wider World and what their responsibilities are when they are out and about. Pupils will also be taking into consideration, the British Values and how these are relevant in everyday life.

Outdoor Education - Pupils will be developing their rock-climbing skills, including specific climbing techniques, the importance of rope safety and anchors and finally footwork whilst climbing.

Maths - Pupils will be continuing to develop their understanding of brackets, equations and inequalities and applying them to answer a range of problem solving and reasoning tasks. Pupils will also be learning about fractions and percentages and applying these in real life situations.

Science - Pupils will be completing a range of practical experiments that test the reactivity of different substances as well as force fields and electromagnets. Pupils will also be carrying out Biology specific projects as well as Chemistry specific projects.

Geography – Pupils will be focussing on learning about Asia and how Asia as a continent is continuously developing and transforming by making comparisons between Asia now and Asia in the past, choosing specific countries to research.

Art & Technology – Pupils will be learning about a range of mediums that can be used to create artwork such as using scissors to create intricate, detailed landscapes and patterns. Pupils will be comparing a range of work to inspire their own final pieces.
