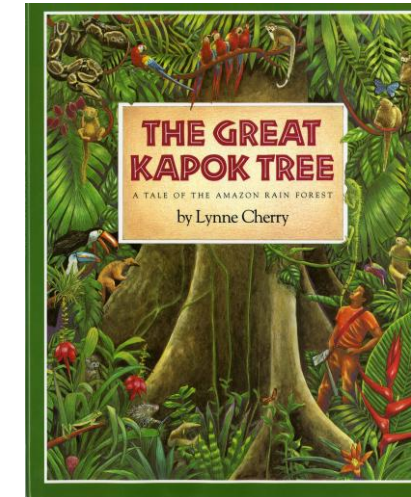
Educational Visits

Text: The Great Kapok tree: A tale of the Amazon Rainforest

In the story, a man begins to chop down a giant kapok tree. As he rests, the animals and creatures of the rainforest quietly approach him. One by one, they whisper reasons why the tree is important and why the rainforest must be protected. When the man wakes up, he must decide whether to continue cutting down the tree or leave it standing. This gentle and powerful tale helps readers understand the importance of protecting the rainforest and the many living things that depend on it.



Curiosity & Knowledge

- English:** Pupils will read, understand, and write both narrative stories and biographies, identifying key features and using appropriate structure and language for each.
- Maths:** Pupils will learn about multiplication, position and direction and time.
- Science:** Pupils will learn about plants and how living things grow and change as they grow up.
- Computing:** Pupils will collect and represent data and information using pictograms to help answer simple questions.

Explore & Make

- Geography:** Pupils will learn about tropical climates and comparing against Polar climates.
- History:** Pupils will learn about Latin explorers, exploring who they were and the journeys they made.
- Art & Design:** Pupils will create art inspired by the rainforest, exploring its colours, plants, animals, and patterns.
- MFL:** Pupils will learn the French words for different types of transport and practise using them in simple speaking and listening activities.
- Music:** Pupils will explore how technology can be used to create and record music, while developing their understanding of musical structure and form through listening, performing and composing.
- RE:** Pupils will explore what beliefs, values and practices are important in different religions and worldviews, developing their understanding of how these shape people's lives and communities.
- Technology:** Pupils will learn about balanced diets and how different foods help keep our bodies healthy.

Health & Me

- PSHE:** Living in the Wider World, pupils will learn about their community and the world around them. They will explore roles, responsibilities, and how to make positive choices that help themselves and others.
- Outdoor Education:** Pupils will be exploring the environment through walking for pleasure
- PE:** Pupils will be learning skills that relate to run, jump and throw, understanding different body movements for each aspect.
- Emotional Intelligence:** Pupils will be developing skills on how to manage minor conflicts in an appropriate way.
- Citizenship:** In this unit, pupils will learn about copyright and ownership. They will explore who owns creative work, how to use materials responsibly, and why it's important to respect other people's ideas and creations.
