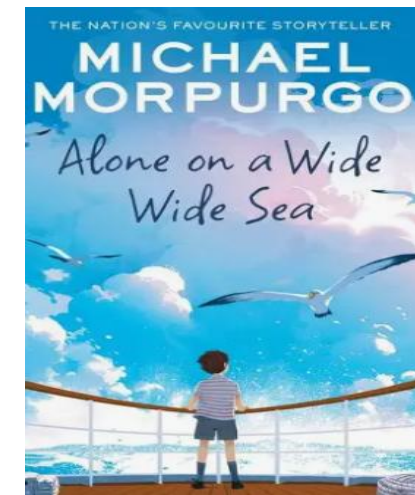

## Curiosity & Knowledge

ABC Pupils will examine the features of explanation texts and apply this understanding in their own writing, while also developing creative writing skills through planning, drafting, and crafting imaginative narratives.

2+3=5 we are exploring mass, capacity, and temperature through practical activities to develop pupils' understanding of measurement and scientific observation.

We are exploring ecosystems and sounds to support pupils understand how living things interact with their environment and how sound travels and is used in nature

We will model data using spreadsheets and learn programming essentials in Scratch to help pupils develop skills in data handling, logical thinking, and coding.

## Explore & Make

Pupils will explore the importance of oceans for the environment, economy, and human life, and develop map skills to locate oceans.

Pupils will investigate Viking and Anglo-Saxon life, their trade routes, and how interactions shaped communities and culture

Pupils will explore Aboriginal Dreamtime stories, understanding their cultural significance, connection to land, and the lessons they teach

Pupils will explore French culture, landmarks, and language, developing geographical knowledge and travel awareness

Pupils will explore key music styles and composers of the 20th century, developing listening skills and understanding cultural influences on music

Pupils will explore the meaning of peace, how it is promoted in communities, and ways to resolve conflict positively

Pupils will explore boomerangs, their cultural significance in Aboriginal history, and the science behind how they fly.

## Health & Me

Pupils will explore different types of relationships, understanding respect, empathy, and strategies for positive communication

Pupils will learn basic cycling skills and understand the importance of road and personal safety

Pupils are given opportunities to practise athletics skills through a range of inclusive PE activities

Pupils will learn strategies to manage and resolve conflicts respectfully, understanding different perspectives and problem-solving skills

Pupils will explore global issues, such as climate change, poverty, and inequality, and consider how they affect communities and the environment
