## Educational Visits

### A Dangerous Crossing by Jane Mitchell

*A Dangerous Crossing* tells the story of Ghalib Shenu, a 13-year-old Kurdish boy living in war-torn Syria. When the violence in his hometown becomes unbearable, his family is forced to leave everything behind and flee in search of safety. Their journey takes them through dangerous cities, refugee camps, and across the sea in an overcrowded, unsafe boat.

Along the way, Ghalib experiences fear, separation, loss, and hardship but also witnesses courage, kindness, and hope. Based on the real experiences of Syrian refugee families, the novel highlights the struggles refugees face while emphasizing the importance of resilience, family, and compassion. It encourages readers to understand the human impact of war and displacement.

## Curiosity & Knowledge

ABC English – Dystopian stories; pupils will look a range of dystopian books. They will compare with our class text 'A Dangerous Crossing' and eventually building up to writing parts of their own Dystopian story.

2+3=5 Maths – Pupils will strengthen their understanding of data handling, picograms, tally charts and how to use this data in real life situations.

Science – Pupils will be focussing on unicellular organisms and understanding the wonders of earth and space.

Computing – The children will design and make their own healthy fitness app.

## Explore & Make

Geography – Exploring coastal environments, landscapes, and how coasts are formed.

History – Learning about the growth and impact of the British Empire.

Art & Design – Creating tribal art.

Modern Foreign Languages (French) – Learning vocabulary and phrases about holiday destinations and describing places and activities.

Music – Creating melodies and exploring different musical styles.

Religious Education – Exploring what influences our and each others beliefs.

Design & Technology – Creating different recipes; two weeks of creating Syrian dishes, Two weeks of bush tucker baking.

## Health & Me

PSHE – Understanding social media, relationships and boundaries within relationships.

Outdoor Education – Pupils will be developing water sport skills with particular focus on water safety whilst paddleboarding.

PE –Pupils also develop officiating skills by applying rules, making fair decisions, and keeping score, helping them to build leadership, confidence, and an understanding of fair play. Through sports such as rounders and cricket, students enhance their physical, social, and decision-making skills.
