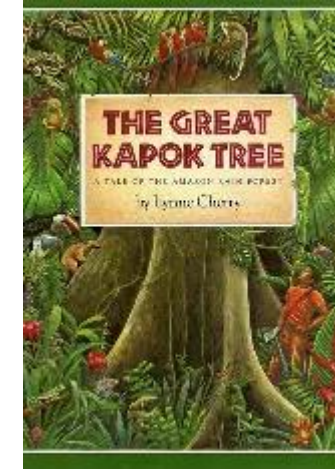

## Educational Visits

### Text: The Great Kapok Tree: A Tale of the Amazon Rainforest.

Deep in the Amazon rainforest, a man begins to chop down a huge kapok tree. As he rests beneath the tree, the animals of the rainforest quietly gather around him. One by one, they explain why the tree is so important to them and to the rainforest. Will the man listen to their message and make the right choice? This beautifully illustrated story teaches readers about the importance of protecting rainforests and the animals that live there.



## Music:

# Curiosity & Knowledge

- English:** Pupils will explore key features of poetry, such as rhyme, imagery and the ways poets express thoughts and feelings.
- Maths:** Pupils will develop their understanding of division, statistics and money through practical activities, learning to share into equal groups, interpret simple data and use coins and notes to solve everyday problems.
- Science:** Pupils will learn about wildlife and how different animals live, grow and survive in their habitats.
- Computing:** Pupils will be introduced to programming using Scratch Jr. They will explore sprites and backgrounds, use and change programming blocks, and begin creating simple algorithms to design their own programs.

# Explore & Make

- Geography:** Pupils will develop their understanding of the Earth's structure by exploring tectonic plates and investigating how their movement can cause earthquakes and volcanoes. They will learn about the impact of these natural events on people and environments around the world.
- History:** Pupils will develop their understanding of the Spanish Conquistadors by exploring their journeys to the Americas, their encounters with indigenous peoples and the impact they had on societies and cultures during the Age of Exploration.
- Art & Design:** Pupils will develop their understanding of rainforest environments by exploring the plants and animals that live within them. They will use a range of materials and techniques to design and create 3D rainforest sculptures inspired by the shapes, textures and colours found in nature.
- MFL:** Pupils will develop their understanding of the life cycle by learning key vocabulary and phrases in the target language. They will explore the stages of growth and change in living things while building confidence in speaking, listening, reading and writing in a modern foreign language.
- RE:** Pupils will learn about the beliefs, values, and practices that are important in different religions and worldviews, and how these influence people's lives and choices.
- Technology:** Pupils will develop their understanding of healthy eating by exploring the principles of a balanced diet, identifying different food groups and making informed choices about foods that contribute to a healthy lifestyle.

# Health & Me

- PSHE:** Pupils will learn how to build and maintain healthy relationships based on honesty, trust, and respect, and recognise positive and negative friendship behaviours.
- Outdoor Education:** Pupils will learn about unique outdoor festivals and traditions from around the world, exploring their cultural significance, history, and the challenges and risks involved in participating.
- PE:** Pupils will learn and develop striking and fielding skills, including batting, throwing, catching, and teamwork, while applying tactics in competitive games.
- Emotional Intelligence:** Pupils will learn to understand that grief is a natural part of life, explore how people experience loss in different ways, and identify meaningful ways to remember and honour those who have died.
- Citizenship:** Pupils will learn what active citizenship means and how individuals can take responsible action to make a positive difference in their community and wider society.
